September 10, 1-3pm Ann McMillan, Fine Art Painter Topic: Enriched-Color Palette Knife Technique


Ann McMillan will be demonstrating her enriched-color palette knife technique in oil, although she also works in pastel.

The Los Gatos Art Association runs a weekly outdoor painting event every Monday and the first Thursday each month.

The location changes every week. All mediums are welcome.

Thursday, September I - Wilder Ranch State Park



North of Santa Cruz on Hwy I past Western Drive. Park Headquarters will be on left. The address is 1401 Old Coast Rd. Fee. This state park offers historic barns corrals and Ranch House, old Adobe and wetlands with the ocean nearby.

September 5 - Alviso Marina



Wetlands with rich colors, waterways and distant hills. Take Hwy 237 (East from Highway 101 or West from Hightwy 880) to North First Street exit. Turn right on North First Street; turn right on Gold Street, left on Elizabeth Street and right on Hope Street.

September 12 & 19 - Coyote Valley off of Palm Ave.



Hay fields with tree studded hills in the distant, barns and ranches nearby. Take 101 south to Bailey Ave, turn right on to Bailey then turn left onto Santa Teresa. Take Santa Teresa Blvd. South to Palm Ave. Go right and left on Palm Ct.

September 26 & October 3 - Moss Landing Harbor



Highway One Working fishing harbor, old and new boats and interesting old buildings. Take 17 south to Watsonville exit. Go South past Watsonville and turn right at power plant onto Moss Landing Rd. Take the next right on Sandholdt Rd. Before bridge turn right into Moss Landing Harbor Parking lot.

Thursday, October 6 - Seymour Marine Discovery



Center Santa Cruz (9:30)
Take Highway 17 South from
San Jose. Take Highway One
North toward Half Moon Bay.
Turn left on Swift Street. Turn
right on Delaware Avenue to
the Seymour Marine Discovery
Center - the final building on
the ocean bluff, next to the
giant blue whale skeleton.

October 10 - Tidal Pools

San Antonio Road, Mountain View Trails with viewing benches and varied bird life. Heading North take 101 to to the San Antonio Avenue off-ramp. San Antonio turns right at Terminal Blvd. There is parking along Terminal Blvd. Park on Terminal Way near entrance to park and restroom.



October 17 & 24 - Davenport

9.5 Miles North of Santa Cruz Coastal cliffs/Ocean and Monterey pines, small but historical and weathered downtown, coffee house and restaurants. Take Hwy I north from Santa Cruz to Davenport. Park on the ocean side a little north of the coffee house.



October 31 & November 7 - McLellan Ranch Park

This 18-acre natural preserve park was a horse ranch in the 1930's and 40's. The site houses a nature museum and community garden. From CA 85 North take exit 18 for Stevens Creek Blvd, Turn left onto Stevens Creek Blvd, Turn left onto Bubb Rd, Take 2nd right onto McClellan Rd.



Thursday, November 3 - Alum Rock Park

15350 Penitencia Creek Road, San Jose. 125 year old park with creek, stone bridges with old trees. Take Penitencia Creek Road off Capitol Expressway. Go east into park and first person there pick a new spot along the road from entrance. Bring a lunch and enjoy the park. Fee \$6, \$2 for seniors.



November 14 & 21 - Laguna Ave and Santa Teresa Blvd

Farm and Ranch land. Tree studded California hills. We will meet on the corner of Laguna Road off Santa Teresa Blvd. All the neighboring roads provide good vistas to paint. Go East on 85 to 101, take exit 373 Bailey Ave, turn right on Bailey and left on Santa Teresa Blvd.
