
**Clark Mitchell

Clark Mitchell is a nationally acclaimed landscape artist and workshop instructor based in Northern California. He travels widely to paint pastel and oil landscape, primarily on location.

Designated a Master Pastelist by the Pastel Society of America and a Distinguished Pastelist by the Pastel Society of the West Coast, Clark has received numerous awards in local as well as national competitions. In 2005, he won Best of Show at the Laguna Plein Air Invitational; and in 2011, Best of Show in the Maui Plein Air Painting Invitational. His paintings have been on the cover of *American Artist*, *Southwest Art* and the *Pastel Journal*.

March 5: Davenport, Waddell Beach



From Los Gatos, take CA-85 S to Hwy 17 S to Santa Cruz. Exit Hwy 1N towards Davenport. Go past Davenport town about 7 miles, parking lot on the left on the coast. Ocean on one side of CA-1, wet lands on the other side. Orange cone and LGAA sign at entrance of parking lot. Restrooms available. View Paintings 12:15pm. [Map](#)

March 12: SJ, San Vicente Ave, Fortini Trailhead



From Los Gatos take CA-85 S to Almaden Exp. S., at the end, turn right on Harry Rd. then left at stop sign onto McKean Rd. Drive a ways to Fortini Rd. and turn left. Drive down to where the road goes off to the right, but turn left onto San Vicente Ave. Small parking area on the right and street parking. No restrooms. Free parking. [Map](#)

March 19: San Martin, Harvey Bear Ranch



From Los Gatos take CA-85 S Take CA-85 S, merge onto US-101 S, go 13.9 mi. Take exit San Martin Ave. Make sharp left onto E. San Martin Ave, go 1.5 mi, turn left into parking lot. Stay and view paintings. [Map](#)

March 26: San Juan Bautista



408 2nd St., San Juan Bautista. From Los Gatos, CA-85 S, merge on US-101 S, exit 156, to San Juan Bautista, go about 3mi, turn left on Alameda at first light signal, right on Polk St., left on 2nd St. Park in front of mission. Stay for lunch, at JJ's; eat and view paintings. [Map](#)

April 2: Rancho Higuero Historical Park



47300 Rancho Higuero Rd., Fremont 94539. From Los Gatos. Head east on CA-85 S for 4.9 mi. Exit onto 5B for CA-87 N, for about 5 mi. Use right lane, exit 5 for I-280 S/680, merge onto I-280 S for 2.4 mi. Keep left on I-680 for 12.4 mi. Use right lane, exit 12, Mission Blvd. E. and merge onto Mission Blvd., go 1.1 mi turn right onto Curtner Rd. for 0.9 mi turn right on Rancho Higuera Rd. Must park on street on the Rancho Higuera Rd. side. Has a Porta Potty.

April 9: Cupertino, Picchetti Winery



13100 Montebello Rd. From Los Gatos, follow CA-85 N to the Stevens Creek Blvd. exit. Go left on Stevens Creek Blvd.. Left onto Foothill Blvd south. It becomes Stevens Canyon Road. Drive to Montebello Road and turn right onto Montebello Road. Drive 1 mile turn left into Picchetti Winery and immediate right into the upper parking lot. Facilities available. [Map](#)

April 16: San Jose, Alum Rock Park



15350 Penitencia Creek Rd. From Los Gatos, take CA-85 S to CA-87 N, then take exit 5 for I-280. Continue onto I-680 N. and go 2.4 mi, take McKee Rd. exit, follow signs for McKee Rd E and merge onto McKee Rd. Turn Left on Toyon Ave, go .09 mi, turn R. on Penitencia Creek Rd. Drive to Alum Rock Falls Rd. The park is on the right. [Map](#)

April 23: Pacific Grove, Lovers Point



From Los Gatos take CA-17 S to CA-1 S, (21.5 mi). Follow CA-1 S to Del Monte Ave. in Monterey. Take exit 402B from CA-1 S, (38.7 mi). Continue on Del Monte Ave. Take Lighthouse Ave. to Ocean View Blvd., (4.1). Pass Lovers Point Park, drive past Shell Ave. Parking lot on the right. Look for LGAA Sign and Orange cone. [Map](#)


April 30: Saratoga, Scenic Spot



This is the spot off Hwy 9 that has views toward the ocean. It has a paved parking area with bathroom and picnic area. Follow Hwy 9 out of Saratoga toward Skyline Blvd. (Rt 35). Go approximately 3 miles past the intersection of Rt 35. Stay on Rt. 9. The paved parking area will be on your left, It is the beginning of the Sky to Sea Trail. [Map](#)
